

Kevin Wing Bio

Kevin Wing is a two-time Emmy Award-honored television journalist in the San Francisco Bay Area. He has worked as a news reporter, producer, special projects producer, writer, field producer, assignment editor, assignment manager and news anchor.

In June of 2016, he reached a career milestone – celebrating 30 years in the San Francisco Bay Area television news industry.



With Fremont's Fourth of July Parade in 2017, Kevin will mark his 19th year as emcee of the parade. He began in 1999. In 1997, his very first emceeing gig for a parade was the Mission San Jose Bicentennial Parade.

Currently, Kevin is a journalist at KNTV NBC Bay Area, the NBC owned-and-operated station for the San Francisco Bay Area. He also owns and operates Kevin Wing Media Communications, a production company that specializes in public sector and corporate video documentaries.

Before arriving at NBC Bay Area in early 2017, Kevin was a Bay Area-based ABC News producer for "Good Morning America", "World News Tonight", "20/20" and "Nightline" from 2006 to 2017. He began his television career in 1986 while still in college, starting as a news writer at KICU-TV Channel 36 in San Jose. The following year, he joined KTVU Channel 2 in Oakland as a weekend assignment editor. In 1988, he began his first full-time TV job as an assignment editor at CBS affiliate KFMB-TV Channel 8 in San Diego. The following year, he relocated to Eureka, where he was hired as a news anchor and reporter at NBC affiliate KIEM-TV, becoming the North Coast's highest-rated anchor after just two months on the air. In 1990, Kevin returned to the Bay Area, rejoining KTVU as an assignment editor and reporter for "Mornings on 2" and "The 10 o'clock News." During his 11 years there, he received numerous honors for his work, including two Emmy awards for best breaking news coverage and best daytime newscast. During his KTVU years, Kevin also spent four years as a freelance reporter at KNTV in San Jose. After leaving KTVU in 2000, he became South Bay Bureau assignment manager at KGO-TV ABC 7 in San Francisco. He has also worked at KRON-TV, also in San Francisco. From 2009 to 2012, Kevin was a content producer at KNTV NBC Bay Area.

In 2013, Kevin was inducted into the Silver Circle of the San Francisco/Northern California Chapter of the National Academy of Television Arts and Sciences for career achievements in the Bay Area spanning more than 25 years. In the history of Bay Area television dating back to 1948, Kevin is among nearly 250 fellow Silver Circle inductees and currently is one of its youngest inductees.

A Fremont native and a seventh-generation Californian (his family arrived in the Golden State in 1854), Kevin's family moved to Fremont in 1963, settling first in the Irvington District for several years before calling the Mission San Jose District home for four decades. Kevin graduated from Mission San Jose High School, Ohlone College and San Jose State University.

Kevin's career highlights include honors from the Associated Press Television Radio Association, the Radio Television News Directors Association, the San Francisco Peninsula Press Club, the Joey Awards, the Telly Awards and the Communicator Awards. In 2013, Kevin received the Governors Service Medallion from the San Francisco/Northern California Chapter of the National Academy of Television Arts and Sciences for his many contributions to the Chapter and the Bay Area television news industry.

For the last decade, Kevin has represented the San Francisco-Oakland-San Jose television market, the nation's sixth-largest, on the Board of Governors of the San Francisco/Northern California Chapter of the National Academy of Television Arts and Sciences. He has served as a Chapter vice president, governor and secretary. Kevin is also editor of "Off Camera", the Chapter's monthly publication, which is distributed to Chapter members throughout California, Nevada and Hawaii.

In 2017, Fremont's Museum of Local History began to include Kevin's video productions as part of the city's history collection.
